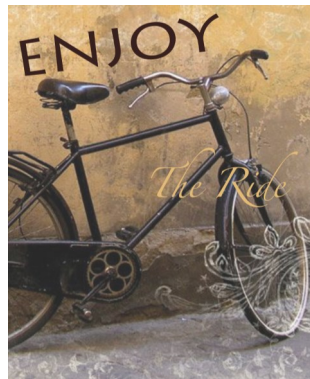

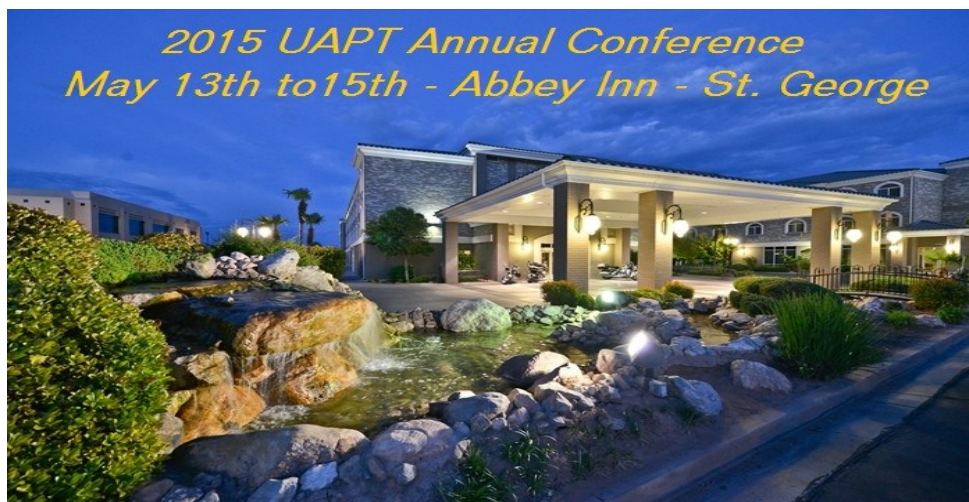
Half way through the conference, Robert Kirby of the Salt Lake Tribute humored the treasurers by putting on a halftime performance that would make Michael Jackson jealous.
